23 CHARLES BONEY: Rent Away. Rent to Own as a sales manager.

24 STANLEY FAITH: He, a, sales manager. He was employed all this time and he really
25 is a good citizen. He just didn't return to the system. And I don't wanna go...well,

2 thought he would be revoked for the rest of the time and he just didn't use his
